Dear Parents and Students,

- Encourages students to leadership in a society facilitating change
- Contributes to a just, inclusive and inviting future
- Knows lasting peace based on justice for the poor and marginalised
- Reflects the equality and human dignity given by God to each person
- Commits to quality teaching and learning

To the students and staff the school motto "Many gifts, one community" provides the focus for challenge to continue the highly professional, competent and cooperative commitment they currently have and to continue to strive for the "higher things" of faith, hope and love. The challenge is to continue to enhance the wonderful community that currently exists. We must seek the face of God in all human beings in everything we do. I would ask all in the community to courageously be a witness to Christ in word and action.

My constant prayer in all areas of life, for the staff and students, can be simply placed in the words of the Old Testament prophet Micah, "This is what Yahweh asks of you: act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with God."

Young people must move forward with confidence, dignity and diligence, in fact a true sense of self worth and equality fuelled and inspired by the Gospel message of Christ and the authentic teachings of love, justice, caring and compassion. The world needs commitment from those who would serve rather than be served. These people are the neighbours of the parable "performing the ordinary extraordinarily well". We strive to be a community of difference through our commitment of difference through our commitment to our faith, hope and love.

I pray that my leadership will continue to have a deep commitment which can nurture love, compassion, commitment, responsibility, honour, truth and justice, in the students and staff with whom I have the privilege to make contact.

Rest assured there will be an emphasis on correct grooming, uniform and values. Education is a privilege that has to be respected through setting standards of quality and high expectations in all aspects of life.
